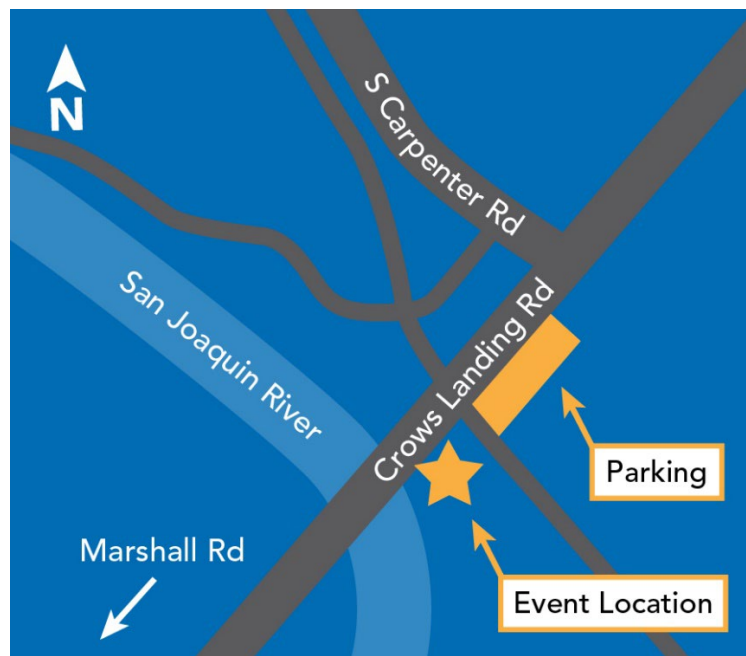
STANISLAUS COUNTY TO CELEBRATE COMPLETION OF CROWS LANDING ROAD BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

*Ribbon-cutting ceremony planned for Monday, June 24th at
10:00 a.m.*

WHAT: Ribbon-cutting ceremony and plaque unveiling commemorating the completion of the [Crows Landing Bridge Replacement Project](#). Open to invited guests and media.

WHEN: Monday, June 24, 2024, at 10:00 a.m.

WHERE: On the Crows Landing Bridge (south of S. Carpenter Rd., near 14018 Crows Landing Rd. in Crows Landing, California).



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PROJECT DETAILS

BACKGROUND: The Crows Landing Road Bridge crosses over the San Joaquin River between Carpenter and Marshall Road, connecting nearby Stanislaus County communities. The bridge serves roughly 8,000 vehicles daily, 20% of which is truck traffic. An assessment determined the original bridge to be structurally deficient, functionally obsolete, and in need of full replacement to provide a safer river crossing.

BENEFITS: The new bridge includes the following improvements:

- Two 12'-wide lanes, one in each direction
- A 12'-wide center median
- A dedicated right turn lane from southbound Crows Landing Road to westbound Carpenter Road
- Additional center median lane north of the intersection for improved merging from eastbound Carpenter Road to northbound Crows Landing Road

CONSTRUCTION TIMING: August 2021 – May 2024

COST/FUNDING: The project's estimated construction cost was \$22,720,477, funded mostly through the federal Highway Bridge Program. Other project funding sources include Senate Bill 1, Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account.

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
